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School No. 4 Gifted & Talented Program

Project Primary focuses on exposing students to four areas of thinking: convergent thinking, divergent thinking, visual/spatial perception, and evaluative thinking. Recently, Project Primary students reinforced their concept of visual thinking through the mental manipulation of shapes using tangrams. Second grade students used visual and convergent thinking as they matched twenty-six pairs of identical but rotated shapes.

Gifted and Talented students are developing deductive thinking skills as they learn to solve a variety of logic problems needed to solve a mystery. Each problem provides an important clue in the mystery. Using these clues, the student detectives eliminate the suspects until only the culprit remains and the mystery is solved!
